- Encourage them to choose two new words from their daily conversation.


## **ENGLISH CONVERSATION**

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

Theme: Sunshine & love

Craft Type: Paper plate picture craft

## Materials Needed:

- Paper plate
- Yellow paint or yellow construction paper
- Father's photo (headshot size)
- Glue stick
- Safety scissors (used by adults)
- **Googly eyes (optional)**
- **Crayons/markers**
- "You are my sunshine!" printed message or written by an adults

# 🧸 Step-by-Step Instructions:

1. Paint the Plate Yellow

Let the child finger paint or brush paint a paper plate yellow. (If messy play isn't allowed, use yellow paper glued on.)

2. Cut & Paste the Photo

Cut out a round photo of the father's face (adult job). Help the child glue it in the centre of the plate — this is the "sun."

3. Add Sun Rays

Help the child tear strips of yellow/orange paper (fine motor fun!) and glue them around the edge for sun rays.

4. Decorate

Let the child colour or add stickers around the sun. Add googly eyes to the photo if you want a silly version.

5. Add Message

Paste or write this message:

"Daddy, you are my sunshine! Happy Father's Day!"

Ricky Rectangle is my name. My four sides are not the same. Two are shot and two are long. Hear me sing my happy song.


#### Trey Trapezoid
